

Intermediate Scrapbookers

How can you decide if a class that is offered by Bloomin' Scrapbooks will be at a level you can handle with your current scrapbooking skills? This next section will discuss both skills and tools that are recommended for the "intermediate" level of scrapbooking.

Proficiency skills for the "intermediate" scrapbooker:

- Has some experience in putting together scrapbook pages
- Can demonstrate a working knowledge of cutting paper, using a personal trimmer
- Is familiar with basic scrapbooking skills, such as matting, journaling, using punches, stickers, and die cuts
- Has some experience using some of the more simple embellishments (brads, fibers, buttons etc.)

Recommended supplies for the intermediate scrapbooker:

- Punches – tag, square, circles of various sizes
- Tweezers
- Glue dots
- Color wheel
- Vellum for journaling
- Brads, eyelets, or other paper fasteners
- Fibers and ribbon
- Paper and supply storage systems
- Idea books
- Paper piercer
- Good supply of cardstock and patterned paper
- Computer fonts for journaling and titles
- Alphabet stamps and ink
- Scrapbook chalk set
- Personal die cutting system (such as QuicKutz)

There are so many products on the market that this list could go on and on. Find the supplies that work for your own particular style and keep a good supply of them readily available.
